# REGISTER BEFORE ELECTION DAY

Election Day is May 29, 2023

## Are you on the list yet?

---

If you're a Canadian citizen, 18+ years of age, and a resident of Alberta, you're eligible to vote! Make sure you're on the List of Electors to help make the voting process fast and easy. Go online to register: [voterlink.ab.ca](https://voterlink.ab.ca)

## First-time voter or recently moved?

---

If this is your first time voting or you previously voted while living at a different address, make sure you register at your current address.

We can update your record and register you to vote!

## Your Where to Vote Card

---

Your Where to Vote Card provides details for your closest advance voting locations and assigned voting location on Election Day. You can choose to receive your Where to Vote Card in the mail or you can opt in to receive it by email when you register.



To make the voting process easier, be sure to bring your mailed or digital Where to Vote Card and personal identification with you to vote. Choose your preferred option now at [voterlink.ab.ca](https://voterlink.ab.ca)

# WAYS YOU CAN VOTE



## Your vote. Your way.

There is a voting option available every day of the election period. Choose the best voting option for you!

### Election Day

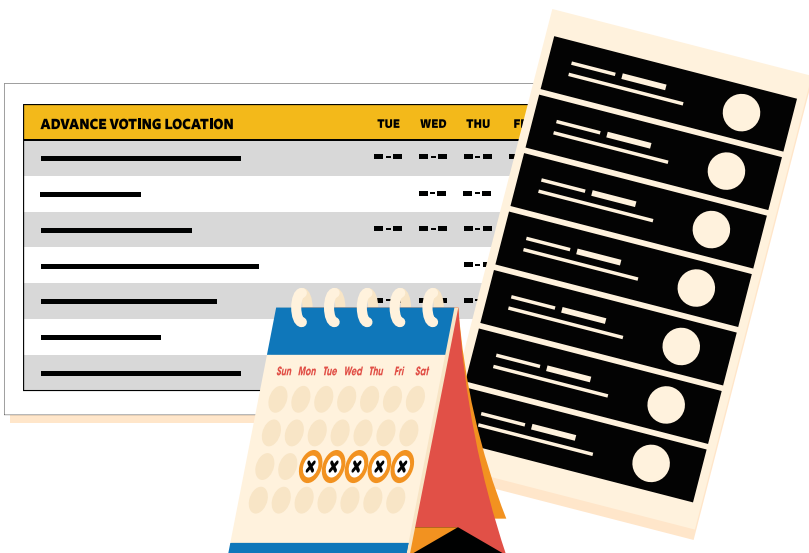
On **Monday, May 29**, vote in person at your assigned voting location. All voting locations will be open from **9 AM to 8 PM**.

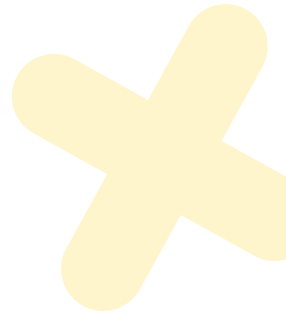
Your Where to Vote Card will tell you where you are assigned to vote. Don't forget to bring your ID.

### Advance Voting

From **Tuesday, May 23**, to **Saturday, May 27**, vote at any of the 300+ locations in Alberta.

With Vote Anywhere you can vote close to home, work, school or recreation activities.

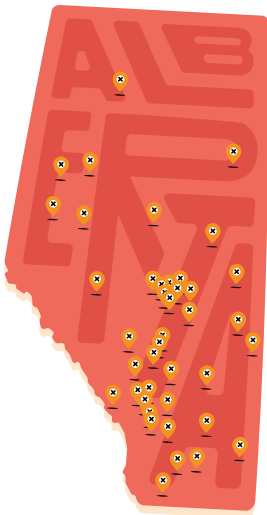




### Vote in the Returning Office

Not able to vote at an advance or Election Day location?

Vote at your local Returning Office from **May 2 to May 29**. Offices are open **weekdays from 9 AM to 6 PM, Saturdays 10 AM to 4 PM and voting days 9 AM to 8 PM**.



### Vote by Mail

Not able to vote in person? Vote by Mail options are available for electors who are away from home during the election period or are unable to vote in person.

You can apply for a Special Ballot voting package to be mailed to you, or request a package for pickup. When you return your ballot, you'll need to provide a copy of your ID and sign a declaration confirming your identity.

Applications for Vote by Mail are currently being accepted. Make your request early and your package will be sent out on **May 1**.

All Vote by Mail packages must be returned to Elections Alberta by **8 PM on Monday, May 29**, to be counted.

# BRING YOUR ID TO VOTE



## You must show ID to prove your identity & address

---

Choose one of four ways:

### Your Alberta ID or Driver's Licence

Show your Alberta Identification Card or Driver's Licence with your name and current residential address.

### Two Pieces of Identification

Show two pieces of ID, both with your name and one showing your current residential address.

### Someone to Vouch for You

If you can't provide any identification or confirm your current address, you can have a registered voter in your voting area vouch for you.

### Use an Attestation Form

You can also use an Attestation Form found at [elections.ab.ca/VoterID](https://elections.ab.ca/VoterID) to establish your identity and residential address.

## Only have a PO Box or other mailing address?

---

Identification showing your current name and physical address is required to vote in the provincial election. Make sure you're registered with both your physical and mailing address to save time when you vote.

If you are not registered with your mailing address when you go to vote, you will need to show ID with your physical address.

Contact Elections Alberta to add your PO Box or other mailing address to your voter record before voting day.

# MAKING VOTING MORE ACCESSIBLE

## Guidelines for voting accessibility

---

We strive to ensure that all voting locations meet our barrier-free criteria. That includes obstacle-free pathways and ramps, doorways a minimum of 36 inches wide equipped with easy-open or automatic entry, and accessible parking where possible.

You can look for the accessibility symbol on your Where to Vote Card to see if the location meets your accessibility needs.

## Voter assistance tools and services

---

Need assistance to vote? No problem! All of our voting locations provide:

- Magnifying sheets
- Large-grip pencils
- Voter Templates for vision-impaired voters
- Election Officers available to assist you
- Printed eligibility and voting instructions available in 27 languages

You may also:

- Bring a friend or family member to assist you with reading or marking the ballot or translating instructions, or
- Bring your own device to help you read or mark the ballot

At select advance voting locations, Voter Assist Terminals are also available to help you read and/or mark your ballot.
