Voting will take place to elect a Member of the Legislative Assembly. Voting hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Additions to the Voters List may be made beginning October 4, 2014 during regular office hours by contacting the Returning Officer: Barbara Willman in Edmonton-Whitemud. Revisions will conclude on Saturday, October 18, 2014 at 4:00 p.m.

Candidate Nomination Papers for the Provincial By-Election must be filed with the Returning Officer during office hours, beginning immediately and concluding at 2:00 p.m. on October 9, 2014.

Returning Officer office hours: 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday to Friday and 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Saturday.

- residency in a remote area

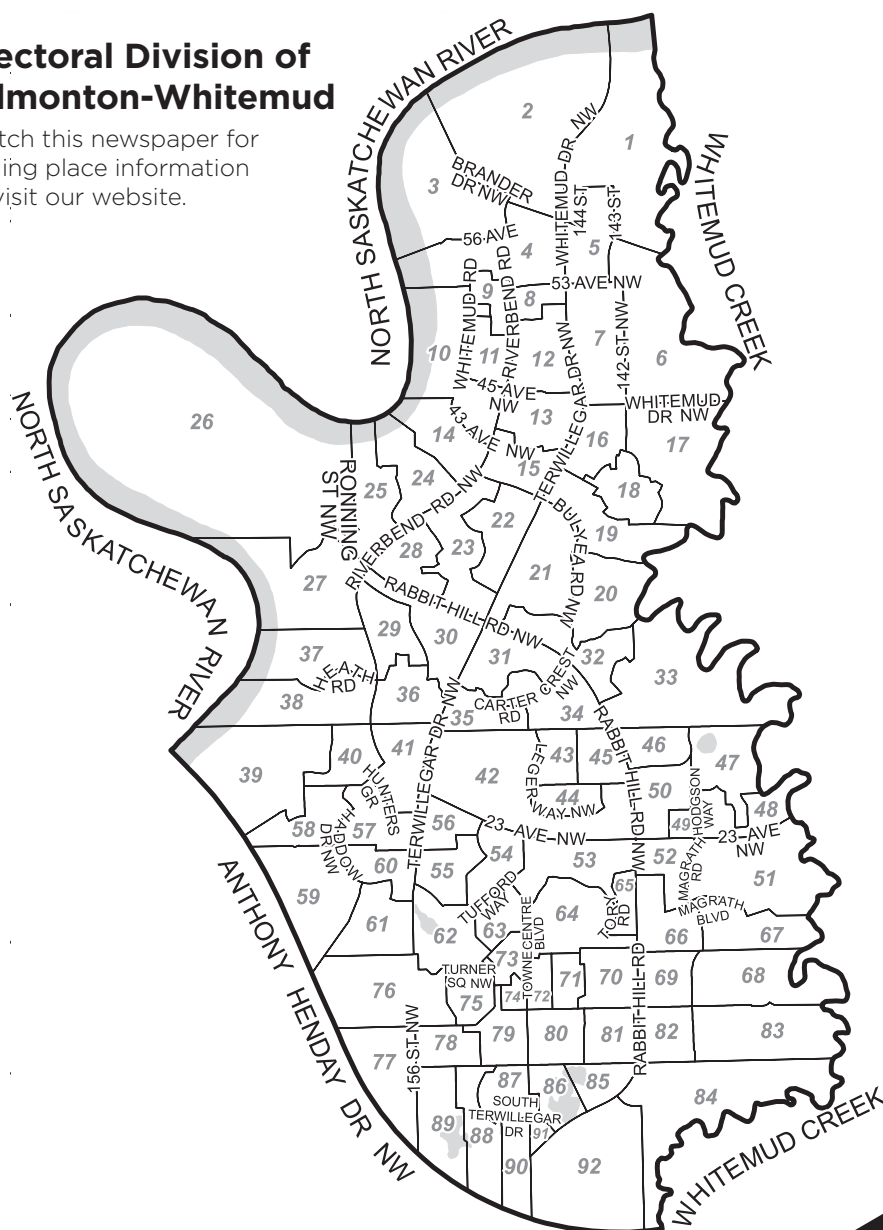
